6 Terrific Techniques for Teaching Active Music:

- 1. Eye Contact
- 2. Encouraging nods and smiles
- 3. EXPLAIN: Give clear instructions BEFORE activity begins, AND as it ends! Demonstrate the moves!
- 4. Tempo slow the song down to teach it turn off the boombox whenever possible.
- 5. Be prepared! Have all materials ready / tapes cued
- 6. Use props, visuals and manipulatives

ABOUT ZIPPER SONGS: These are great for EC,

because you just repeat the verse over and over, "zipping" in a new body part or movement – as in "Old MacDonald". Children can join in quickly or suggest the next movement!

(best with a felt board – paint a tree on flannel attached to a bulletin board or foamcore board, make felt apples w/ 2 smiling apples! Invite children to put apples of different colors on the board, sneaking the two smiling apples on as they finish. Before starting, ask if they think there could be a happy apple on the board – find it – is it high or low? Sing!) Way up high in the apple tree

(repeat with another smiling apple, then do next verse)
