Parents Goals for Bridget in Second Grade

Bridget's individual goals:

- Bridget will be fully included in second grade. Her program should be model after her first grade program
- Bridget should receive as many services possible in the general education classroom (i.e. Speech therapy, OT, PT and phonics)
- Bridget should be challenged as much as possible. She should be given every opportunity to succeed in the general education classroom
- She should work on all her IEP goals, As determined by the special education teacher. The goals should be updated on a regular basis
- Bridget should be encouraged to work independently with minimum assistance. She should participate in all the cooperative learning opportunities with her classmates who can assist her when appropriate. Classmates should be encouraged and informed about how they can help and assist Bridget.

Psycho/Social

- If any problems occur in the classroom with peers that will negatively impact Bridget the social worker should be consulted
- If children have questions about Bridget's disability they should be answered honestly by the teacher. I there are further concerns Bridget's mother will come to the class to discuss Down Syndrome and other disabilities as a Disability Awareness Presentation.
- Herefore a Bridget should always be encouraged and expected to behave in an age appropriate fashion.
- Behavioral expectations should be expressed often and if behavior becomes an issue a team meeting (including parents) should be scheduled as soon as possible.

Educational

The second grade teacher should be informed about inclusion and the tools and strategies that work for Bridget. She should have adequate support from our consultant from LADSE and the special education teacher.

She should have the opportunity for an in-service or continuing education in the area of inclusion

The team should have regularly scheduled team meetings that should include the 2nd grade teacher, special ed. Teacher and parents. (Speech, OT, Social Worker should be invited)
