We do this through an innovative approach that helps leaders focus on creating the necessary supports and conditions for effective teaching and learning.

Why This Approach?

We focus on strengthening leadership and creating an environment to deliver ongoing professional development. We believe teacher effectiveness and student achievement hinges on it. Research has found that professional development that is routine, fixed within an organization and led by school leaders is effective in changing teaching practices and sustaining improvements. It's more effective than traditional professional development that is focused on the teacher in isolation and doesn't have a process for applying new knowledge in practice.

What Will Leaders Receive?

The Ounce, in partnership with the McCormick Center for Early Childhood Leadership at National Louis University, will provide leaders with the following support services during a 16-month engagement:

1. **Training:** Knowledge development for leaders on instructional leadership and organizational supports and conditions for effective teaching and learning
2. **Technical Assistance:** Individualized support to help leaders apply knowledge, establish systems and change practice
3. **Peer Learning and Support:** Community of practice for leaders to reflect, examine their practice, learn from and with their peers
4. **Resources & Tools:** Protocols, job aids, guides and videos of effective leadership and teaching practices
5. **Mini-Grants:** Leaders may apply for a small monetary grant to support their quality improvement efforts

What Does It Cost?

Lead Learn Excel is offered at *no* cost to eligible programs. Participants are also eligible for travel reimbursements. This work is funded by a Race to the Top-Early Learning Challenge grant, in partnership with the Illinois State Board of Education, the Illinois Department of Human Services and the Governor's Office of Early Childhood Development.

What Programs Are Eligible?

Any Silver- or Gold-rated program in ExceleRate Illinois that serves at-risk children may apply to participate.

Who Can Participate?

This program is designed specifically for instructional leaders, including: school principals, assistant principals, PFA program administrators, preschool coordinators, special education coordinators, etc.

Lead Learn Excel can help Silver-rated programs [move toward Gold](#), and help Gold-rated programs maintain their rating. Lead Learn Excel also includes support services for Gold-rated programs that wish to pursue an [Award of Excellence in Preschool Teaching & Learning](#) and/or [Infant & Toddler Services](#), becoming an exemplar in Illinois.
